Thank you to all our pupils, families and staff for their resilience in coping with an increase in covid cases. Despite national shortages of staff and supply staff, we have been able to cope with staff absences and are doing all that we can to fulfil our priorities of keeping children and our community safe and the school open. This week, the Director for Education shared that rates in primary-aged children have significantly increased in Richmond and Kingston, despite the fall in wider society, which perhaps gives some context about why measures imposed in schools seem at odds with the relaxation of measures elsewhere. We hope that all those currently affected by infections remain well, and are optimistic that short, sharp measures bring case numbers across the borough down.
