Sport fixtures


Well done to all our athletes representing the school this week. We are going to need a bigger trophy cabinet!

Did you know that Year 5 and Year 6 have been writing letters in French to their French pen-pals? We have connections with two schools: one is in Paris and


the other in Nancy.
