

Build Update

In January, we advised that plans were underway to replace the cedar block classrooms. Plans have been sumitted for four new classrooms and 2 small intervention rooms that can be opened up to create one larger space. The project is currently out to tender. We anticipate that the old buildings will be demolished over the summer holidays and the new build will commence. We look forward to working with the contractor once appointed and will share timeline details when agreed. French Curriculum

This year we have made changes to the delivery of the French curriculum and are really pleased with the impact. French has been introduced to the KS1 timetable on Wednesday mornings with Monsieur Shaw and Reception will be introduced to new French vocabulary in the Summer Term. In KS2 lessons are now weekly for 45 minutes rather than 60 mins fortnightly.

Fortunately, with funding from the PTA, we were able to refurbish the two main blocks and other areas have been upgraded as part of building projects leaving only the Year 4 area needing attention. We are very pleased that the Local Authority has approved a request for funding to refurbish these toilets too. The design includes a total reconfiguration of the space which will provide more toilets and transform a very tired facility into a fresh, modern space.
