Safeguarding – Young Carers

A young carer is someone aged 25 and under who cares for a friend or family member who, due to illness, disability, a mental health problem or an addiction, cannot cope without their support. They may also have a sibling with an illness or disability which means they face additional responsibilities or have to cope with challenges that other children do not.

It is important that school is aware of such situations so that we have an understanding of the additional pressures faced by the young person and can ensure that any available support is offered to the child and family.
