
Welcome

If you are in Ducklings Class you will be known as 'The Ducklings'.






Inside Ducklings Class

Learning and Playing

Mathematics

This means you will learn the importance of numbers and the kind of activities you might do look like this.







Understanding the World.

In exploring the learning area, you will use your senses to discover the world. You will begin to think about how things work and learn about the people in our lives.



Literacy

You will learn to read and write by learning to recognise the sounds in words.







Expressive Arts and Design

You will listen to music and learn to create and perform your own music. You will also learn to sing some of our school's favourite songs. We give you lots of chances to make your own pictures and models.

Home Visit









We like to come to visit you at your home so we can meet you together with your family, pets and special teddies. We can find out about what you really like to play with. You can also ask us about any thing you would like to know.

Clothes





We like the children in our school to feel like they belong to a big school family and so we wear special clothes to school called a uniform. You might like to practise putting some of these things on by yourself.

Arriving to School



Our school gates open at 8.40am. From then, you can come into school and line up in one of the cones with your friends from your class.



At 8.50am, your teacher will come outside to take you to your classroom. You can wave goodbye to your parents or carers so you can start your exciting and fun day!

School Day-Morning



We have little pictures on the board to help you know what is happening during the day. This is how a normal day looks in the first half-term, although it sometimes changes.



We start the day by saying hello to each other.



Then we have a short learning time on the carpet.



Next you can choose something to play with indoors or outdoors.



After that we come back together and do some more learning together. Then we will have a piece of fruit and some water or some milk.



Now you can choose something to play with again.



Then it will be tidy up time.



Next it will time to wash our hands and eat some lunch. After lunch you'll have a play time.

School Day-Afternoon



In the afternoon you might feel a bit tired until you get used to school so the afternoon is not as busy.



After lunch we'll say good afternoon to each other.



In the afternoon we might do yoga or other fine motor activities.



Then you will choose again for a little while.



After, it will be tidy up time.



Next it will be story time.



Finally, it will be time to get your things and go home.

Snack Time





At snack time we give you a piece of fruit. You can have a drink of water at any time but at snack time we all have a drink of water or milk.

Lunch Time



At lunch time we wash our hands. Your teacher will tell you what is for lunch and take you to the dining room. They will stay with you to make sure there is something you like. There are usually 3 choices of warm food and lots of delicious salads to choose from the salad bar.
