Diwali assembly


Key Stage 2 enjoyed a wonderful and educational assembly about Diwali, the Hindu festival of lights. Nabhinandan Das from the London Institute of Vedic Education delivered the assembly and the children learnt a traditional Diwali song and were immersed in the story of why Diwali is celebrated.



Road Safety

We have worked hard with our green wall, increased gate opening times and working with TfL on 'Safer Streets' to make our school safe. However, a number of parents are parking on red lines which is dangerous and disruptive. This is particularly bad on Sutherland Gardens. Parents are reminded not to park on red lines for the safety of all pedestrians and road users. Where possible, we encourage pupils to walk to school, or for families to park further from the school and then walk the remaining distance.





Year 6 impressed the school with their historical learning about the Ancient Egyptians on Wednesday. As well as celebrating their learning so far this term, the children enjoyed writing hieroglyphics, an Egyptian dance lesson and sampling some delicious Egyptian-inspired school lunches.
