
Enter your child's username and password (from their reading record)

## Where is my child's Renaissance Reader username and password?

This should be in their reading record. Only children in Key Stage 2 (years 3-6) use Renaissance Reader. If your child does not have log in information, please speak to their class teacher.

Please check carefully and ensure that the Renaissance ID is correct. \


# What does it mean when my child does not pass a quiz?

Children need to complete at least 80% of the questions correctly to pass a quiz. Most quizzes have just ten questions.

It is not unusual for a child not to pass

every quiz as this may be affected by how much they enjoyed a book or their

level of background knowledge. If a child is repeatedly struggling to pass quizzes at their current book level (the colour of book agreed by their teacher) then we may change that colour to see whether the quiz scores improve.



#### Why has my child not completed any quizzes on Renaissance Reader?

Some children may be reading Key Stage 1 books and not all of these texts have quizzes on Renaissance Reader. Please be assured that, as their reading levels progress, children will begin to use the website for quizzing.

If your child is reading Key Stage 2 books, please help us to encourage them to quiz every time they finish a book. All children have opportunities to quiz on their books throughout the week.

## My child has completed an assessment at school and given a ZPD. What does this mean?

ZPD stands for Zone of Proximal Development. It suggests the range of levels from which a student should be selecting books for maximum growth in reading without frustration. This is an approximate range and teachers will use their professional judgment to choose the level of books that match an individual student's needs.
