YEAR FIVE CURRICULUM BULLETIN SUMMER TERM

Dear parents/carers,

Welcome back to another fun, rewarding and busy term at ESPS! We hope you had a relaxing and enjoyable holiday and, like us, are looking forward to the summer term in Year 5!

This is the last of our termly bulletins where we aim to provide you with information about the curriculum. A school timetable is also attached for your reference. You can find a full overview of the Year 5 curriculum [here](#).

Homework

Reading

- Children should read for **30 minutes a day**. Where possible, an adult at home should hear the child read.
- Children should **write in their reading diaries 5 times a week**. They might write a sentence about the plot or define new vocabulary.
- **Reading diaries must come into school each day** and be taken home each evening.
- [Renaissance Reader](#) is a web-based program we use where children complete a quiz about each book they read. They can quiz in class or independently at home.

Maths

- Maths homework is based on lessons taught during the week and is completed on **Mathletics** (a web-based program).
- Maths homework is **set on Thursday to be completed by the following Wednesday**.
- Children are expected to continue to practise their times tables regularly using [Times Table Rockstars](#) (a web-based program). Times Table Rockstar battles between classes will happen throughout the term and we encourage all children to participate.

Spellings

- Spelling words for each week are sent home at the beginning of every term.
- Every Thursday, that week's spellings are also set on [Spelling Shed](#) (a web-based program).
- Spellings are tested on Thursday.

English

Our lessons will continue to cover all aspects of reading, writing, grammar and punctuation and spoken language. The children will be doing an in-depth study of the novel *The Boy at the Back of the Class* by Onjali Q. Rauf, exploring different themes and issues raised in the novel. In the second half of the summer term, the children will be introduced to William Shakespeare's *A Midsummer Night's Dream* to study alongside our Tudor topic.

Maths

All maths work will be taught in accordance with the National Curriculum. This term, we will cover geometry (shape, position and direction), number (decimals and negative numbers) and measurement (converting units and volume). Developing reasoning and problem-solving skills will remain a focus.

Science – Forces and Earth and Space

We will start with the study of forces, making links with gravity, air resistance and water resistance. For the second half of the summer term, the children will be learning about the various phenomena related to our planet and the space around it. They will be taking the role of presenters to explain and demonstrate their learning.

Computing

Throughout the year, we constantly refresh our knowledge and skills in e-safety. We will learn about potential online dangers.

Unit 5 Creating Media: in the first half-term, children will explore stop-motion animation by storyboarding, taking photographs and editing.

Unit 6 Data Handling: in the second half-term, children will develop 3D design skills.

History – The Tudors

The children will learn about different aspects of Tudor Britain including their lives, origins, religion, monarchy and crime and punishment. They will become historians and study different historical sources to investigate the past.

Art and D&T – Sculpture and Mechanical Toys

In the first half term, we are exploring the medium of expressive sculptures. In the second half term, the children will take part in a Design & Technology project, where they will work in groups to design and build a cam mechanism.

RE – Hinduism

In RE we will be learning about Hinduism. Our key question that we will be exploring is: *Do beliefs in Karma, Samsara and Moksha help Hindus lead good lives?*

PSHE

In PSHE lessons, we will continue to use Jigsaw, the mindful approach to PSHE (Personal, Social, Health Education) which is a teaching and learning programme that includes the statutory RSHE (Relationships, Sex and Health Education) curriculum and has a strong focus on emotional and mental health and wellbeing. This term, the children will learn about Relationships and Changing Me, including puberty.

Music

As well as weekly singing assemblies and regular singing in class, children will listen to, perform and explore a wide range of music. In the summer term, Year 5 will explore music from Bali, compose in ternary form and perform as an ensemble.

Thinking Schools

The children will continue to use tools from their 'Thinking School' toolkit, including thinking maps, thinking hats and habits of mind. The 'Thinking School' methodologies aim to equip children with the thinking skills needed to effectively tackle problems across and beyond the curriculum, both at school and in the future, through deep and critical thinking.

Physical Education (PE)

Friday sessions continue to be led by NS Sport coaches where they will be participating in cricket, athletics and badminton. Additionally, the children will be strengthening their athletics and striking and fielding skills in their weekly PE lessons led by their class teacher.

PE Kit

We would ask for your assistance in ensuring that your child arrives to school in their correct PE kit on Mondays and Fridays. The correct PE kit is made up of the school blue PE t-shirt, a pair of blue or black shorts or a pair of blue or black tracksuit bottoms and sturdy trainers. Please note that football tops are NOT permitted to be worn for PE.
