- Make reading a fun family activity.

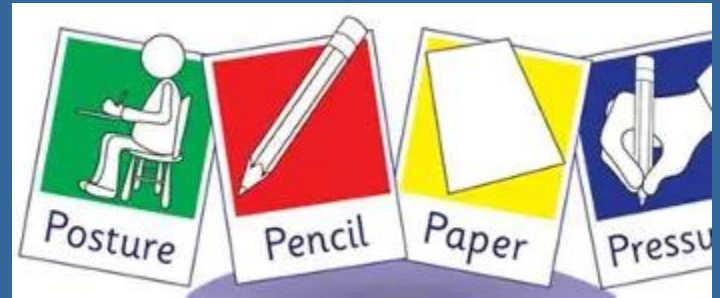

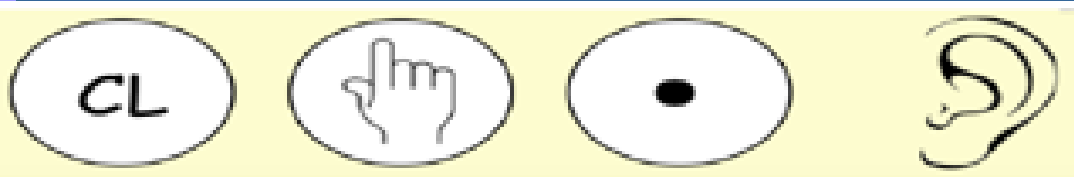

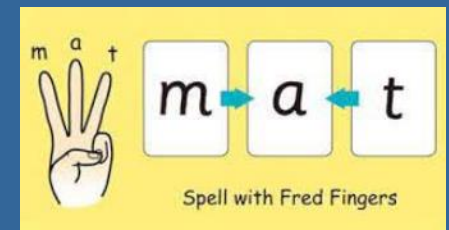

Tips:

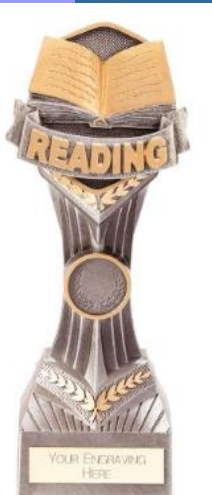
'Fred Talk out loud'

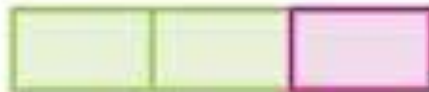

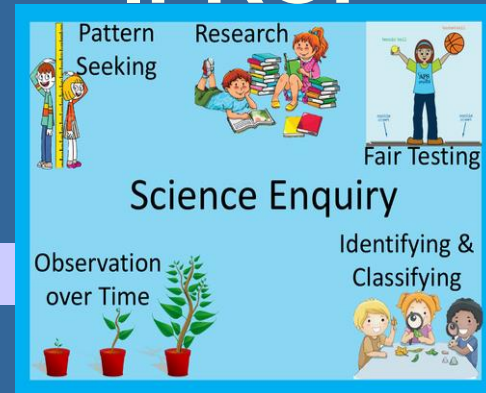

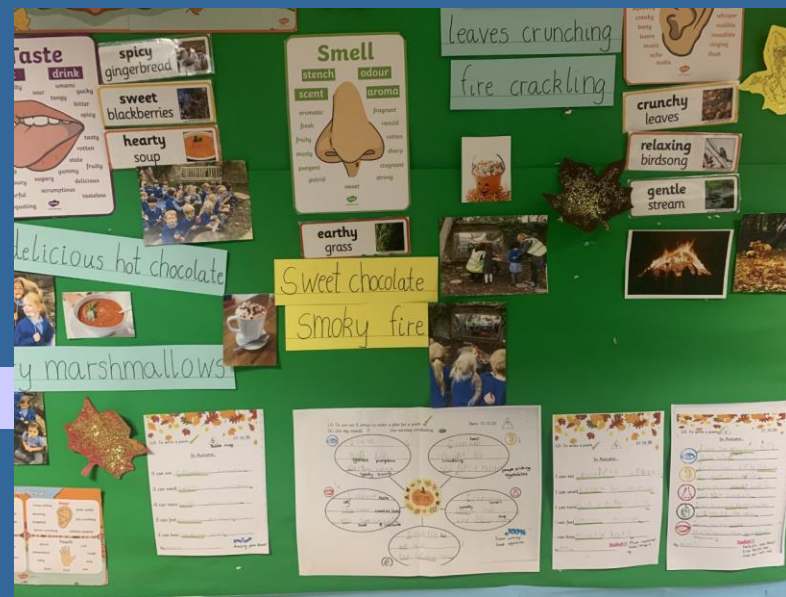
