### Kings College Monitoring Project



This week you may have noticed children (and staff) carrying rucksacks on their journeys to and from school. These children have been air quality scientists, monitoring air quality as they travelled around the local area. Kings College London now have the task of analysing the data and will provide results to the school in due course. The children involved attended a briefing lesson on Monday and some were involved in a film for Dyson who are the manufacturers of the monitoring devices. We were also visited by BBC radio who interviewed some of the participants, so ESPS may feature shortly on national radio!

We now have the results from our diffusion tube monitoring of NO<sub>2</sub> for November 2018. This is raw data, still to be validated, but we are very comforted by the results. All nine locations around school were comfortably below the EU limit of 40ug/m<sup>3</sup>. Classroom levels ranged between 9.43 and 13.19ug/m<sup>3</sup>. Levels in the playground by the green-wall were 27.75 and to the rear of the school 25.46ug/m<sup>3</sup>. To put this into context, data (yet to be validated) gathered for levels in Richmond Park for the same time period was 22.0ug/m<sup>3</sup>. We will continue this monitoring programme for 12 months.
