

Sports Premium 2017-2018 spending:

Impact:

We have bought basketball nets this year and entered competitions for Y4 and Y6-a new sport for us this year. We came second and third respectively. Our girls' football team won the 2017-2018 Football Festival and went on to represent Richmond Borough at the London Youth Games where they were crowned London Champions on winning the event. Our netball team entered the Surrey Storm event for the first time where again they won. They represented the London Region in an event at the Copperbox in June, the day after returning from their Outward Bound trip! They played well and represented the school honourably. Y2 girls competed in a football festival and won the event. Y3 girls have also competed in a football event and won. Thirteen children got through to the swimming gala finals where our boys gained 4th place in the borough overall (out of 47 schools.) One boy became borough champion for freestyle. We entered cross country runners from Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6 and one of our Y5 boys gained the silver medal. Y1 have enjoyed sessions with a tennis coach. Basketball coaches ran sessions with Y6 in the summer term and tennis coaches worked with Y4. Children in Y1 and Y3 took part in a gymnastics event. Rugby players from Harlequins have volunteered to come to read with our children. Y5 won the Y5 Kwik Cricket festival to be crowned borough champions. Children from Y1-Y4 competed in a range of athletics events. Now that our building work is over we have been able to mark out the daily mile and children and staff

The school continues to participate in all borough tournaments and every opportunity is taken to extend competitive sports to Y3, 4 and 5. Inter house tournaments take place termly to ensure all children enjoy team competition. Running club is so popular that year group lunchtime clubs have started.

Impact of Sports Premium 2016/2017

The impact of this grant on sport at East Sheen 2016-2017 has continued to increase with even higher participation and opportunities to represent the school. We participated in all events as in 2015/2016 and reached the borough semi finals in girls' football where we were knocked out by the eventual league winners. We continued to produce borough champions in swimming and performed well in cross country and running events. Children in all yeargroups from Y1 to Y6 have represented the school in a range of sports, including boys and girls football, girls netball, mixed netball, athletics, Kwik cricket and tag rugby,. As our school is expanding to three form entry we have increased opportunities for development squads to compete with local schools and represent the school in borough events where possible, as well as increasing opportunities for inter house events at school. We have three lunchtime running clubs for children in KS2, and after school multiskills and gymnastics clubs for KS1 and girls and boys football, cricket and tag rugby clubs for KS2. We have also introduced yoga as a class activity and as a club as part of our wellbeing focus.

This year has been a year of building works and reduced space and we are proud that we have continued to offer a wide range of sports for children. We had to put on hold the introduction of the daily "mile" but made sure we took children off site to run and ensured our children could compete with confidence. Children in Y3 and Y4 took part in a locality sports day, children in Y1 and Y2 attended events run by local secondary schools and competed in some "friendly" matches with local schools.

Wall bars and fixed apparatus were moved to more suitable positions in our new hall and all gymnastics equipment has been maintained, repaired or renewed.

We have employed sports coaches four times a week at lunchtime to model active engagement of children in play to midday supervisors so they are upskilled and confident to encourage physical games. 1041 participants have been recorded so far (481 girls and 560 boys) across the yeargroups from Reception to Y6. Grandma's footsteps, hide 'n' find, fitness circuits, physical story-telling and team tag are just some of the activities enjoyed by the children and led by the coaches. Balls, hoops, targets, skittles support lunchtime play as do playground markings to encourage active play, such as "four square" and "hopscotch".

The termly inter house competitions have also been hugely successful, allowing all children the opportunity to compete in teams. This develops skills of cooperation and support as well as team spirit, raises self-esteem and builds resilience.

The school fund contributed £23000 to fully resurface the playground outside our new building so a national standard netball court could be provided. Hockey club will be reintroduced 2017-2018 now we have our space back!

Sports Premium 2015/2016 – Grant: £9,375 (£858 carried over from 2014-2015)

We are committed to using this resource in developing high quality PE lessons, alongside greater opportunities for sporting competitions, and better playtimes for all our young people.

The impact of this grant on sport at East Sheen this year has been huge, with very high numbers of children having opportunities to represent the school at events ranging from cross country to Y1 girls' football, from Y4 athletics to Y3 hockey. Attached at the foot of this page is a sports newsletter which evidences the levels of involvement throughout the whole school; competitions are now no longer the reserve of the Y6 "A" teams! The quality of sports' coaching delivered by Next Step Sports resulted in all our teams reaching at least quarter final stage, with semi finals in netball and our girls winning the Richmond Football league. Sport enjoys a high profile at the school and the grant has enabled us to develop our sports teaching within school and increase involvement. Next year's target is based on improving physical fitness for all.

Impact:

The school continues to participate in all borough tournaments and every opportunity is taken to extend competitive sports to Y3, 4 and 5. By the end of May, 206 additional opportunities for children from Y1-Y6 have been created for children to represent the school. Inter house tournaments take place termly to ensure all children enjoy team competition. Running club is so popular that a second lunchtime club has started. NSSport plan to introduce a running programme "a mile a day". The aim is to increase fitness for all children, with personal goals and targets.

The girls' football team has won the borough league final beating Hampton Juniors 2:1 in a thrilling match. This is a fantastic achievement. The netball team reached the semi-finals, the boys' football team topped their group and reached the quarter finals whilst in the borough swimming gala the boys were overall runners-up. In the cross country event for children in Y3-Y6 our team came second with Y3 winning gold.

In addition to the before and after school sports clubs, NSSport provide two coaches to run a range of activities and games for children to access during lunchtimes if they so wish. A staggering 1027 participants have been recorded so far (453 girls and 574 boys) across the yeargroups from Reception to Y6. Grandma's footsteps, hide 'n' find, fitness circuits, physical story-telling and team tag are just some of the activities enjoyed by the children and led by the coaches.

The termly inter house competitions have also been hugely successful, allowing all children the opportunity to compete in teams. This develops skills of cooperation and support as well as team spirit, raises self-esteem and builds resilience.

Impact:

Profile of sport in the curriculum has risen. Our high quality facilities enable us to host many matches and competitions, both internally and against other schools. The girls were runners up in the borough gala and all sports teams finished in the top half of the table with the boys' football team reaching the quarter finals. Competitions were introduced for children in Y2, Y3, Y4 and Y5 and development squads in Y5 and Y6 have enjoyed training sessions. This has enabled more children to represent the school and experience competition.

Impact: 2013/2014 was overall our best sporting year ever. We reached the semi-finals in girls' and boys' football, netball and tag rugby. We also significantly improved our performance in the LA swimming gala. All our teachers have been involved in high quality training delivered by PE consultant, Donna Smith which has resulted in improved gymnastics sessions. Club provision has also increased with karate taking place daily and fourteen other sports clubs running each week. The clubs are at capacity and the children's enthusiasm for sport was reflected in the high number of participants (over 200) in the PTA 5km fun run.

Results in our 2014 Pupil Survey show that 'I enjoy playtimes' has increased to 93% from 86% in 2013.
