PE Kits

We have noticed that some of our children are not looking as smart as they should do in their PE lessons or do not have a kit at all. Please could you ensure that your child has a full PE kit available in school for their lessons; this is essential to ensure they can participate fully and safely. Each class has two PE sessions a week (apart from the classes that have swimming). The children should wear a school PE t-shirt and blue shorts. For the winter months, school track suit bottoms are available otherwise plain blue tracksuit bottoms can be worn. School sweatshirts or fleeces should be worn for an extra layer. Non-uniform hoodies are not acceptable. Please also ensure that all items are named. If children are attending a club before school and will be staying in their kit for part of the day they should wear school PE kit, otherwise they must change back into their school uniform by the beginning of the school day.
