Our onsite provision for vulnerable children and children of critical workers continues in order to safeguard their welfare and ensure that essential services can continue to function. However, we are appealing to parents only to send eligible children to school if they cannot safely be cared for at home. The latest guidance published by the government states that. Parents and carers who are critical workers should keep their children at home if they can. Currently numbers in school are significantly higher than during the first lockdown. The faster we can bring the cases down, the sooner everyone will be back in school. Thank you!
